Charter

Irish Brigade Camp #4, with rank from August 21, 1999, was chartered on August 12, 2000. The Camp was authorized to conduct business beginning January 20, 2001.

The first formal year for the Irish Brigade Camp #4 was used to refine the administrative infrastructure and learn about the backgrounds of the members and their Union Army ancestors. It was a modest approach to better understand our heritage which set the example for the coming years.

The Camp participated in the Luminaria Ceremony at the National Cemetery in Fredericksburg, VA during the Memorial Day observance, and the Sergeant Kirkland Memorial Ceremony in December commemorating the First Battle of Fredericksburg in 1862.

Members of the Camp also participated in the First Manassas Reenactment and Remembrance Day ceremonies at Gettysburg, PA.

Additionally the Camp appointed a member to the Federal Hill Board which was seeking support for proper restoration of the Civil War era home in Fredericksburg.
